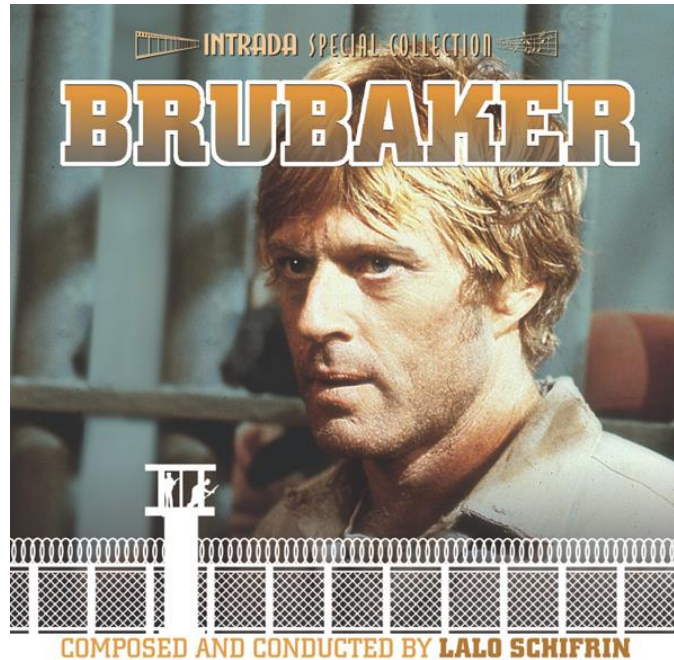

In 1980, the story of warden Thomas Murton, newly appointed warden in a rural Arkansas prison, was finally released from jail itself after a near decade of changing writers, directors, and even studios. The 20th Century Fox film ultimately starred Robert Redford as Murton and was directed by Stuart Rosenberg (who also directed *Cool Hand Luke*, *Voyage of the Damned*, and *The Amityville Horror*).

Interestingly, the aforementioned Rosenberg films also boasted Oscar-nominated scores by Lalo Schifrin. *Brubaker* became their next collaboration, although it is interesting how much of what Schifrin wrote and recorded isn't in the film at all. As Nick Redman comments in the album's liner notes, "One would imagine a film almost entirely set in a prison would leave little room for musical variety, but as with *Cool Hand Luke*, Lalo's penchant for capturing the many moods of rural America found much assorted expression.

There is a full range of country instrumentals, dramatic underscoring, blues, rock, and big-band numbers, as well as urban funk, jazz, and vocal performances..." This presentation of *Brubaker* in the Intrada Special Collection is the premiere release of Lalo Schifrin's score.
